Although we recognize that true Christianity is a matter of the inward heart and not the outward appearance, it is nonetheless true that appearance is important. Therefore, administration seeks to encourage Christian young people to be concerned with the biblical principle of modesty.

There are special services, conferences, and competitions that will require our young people to dress their best. It is important that both boys and girls have dress shirts, blouses, ties, etc. available. Students and parents will be notified in advance of these activities.

GENERAL DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

Students must be in dress code, neatly dressed, and well groomed upon entering the campus at the beginning of the day. They must remain in dress code throughout the day except during their P.E. class or sports practice.

Students in third grade and above will participate in regular weekly P.E. activities and will be required to “dress out” for this class. Students will wear either P.E. shorts or uniform culottes (girls only), that reach the knees or below, and the school T-shirt. The P.E. shorts and uniform culottes are available through Vicki Marsha Uniforms.

College names, sport teams, brand names, and NCS related slogans are permitted on outer garments.

No immodest clothing is permitted at any school sponsored event.

Each student is issued an NCS T-shirt at the beginning of the year. This must be worn on field trips, during P.E., and other special occasions throughout the year. Any student not wearing the NCS T-shirt for the specified activity will have a shirt re-issued to them, and the parents will be billed for the cost.

Hats are not to be worn inside any building.

Sweatshirts are not to be worn during chapel.

Gang related hairstyles, clothing (baggy or oversized), tattoos, and piercings (other than in earlobes for girls) are not permitted.

Changes will be made in the dress code if new fads or styles of clothing are introduced which are not in good taste or of neat appearance.

GIRLS’ DRESS GUIDELINES (GENERAL)

Jumpers, skirts, and dress lengths should have a hemline no higher than the middle of the knee. Purchase these with a long enough hemline to account for growth throughout the year.

Pants (long or short) are not appropriate school dress for most school-sponsored activities. Exceptions to this rule will be communicated prior to the activity where they can be worn.

Blouses and shirts must be modest, not see-through, and may have only the top button unbuttoned. For modesty sake, no underclothing should be seen through the blouse or shirt. Blouses and shirts should be tucked in if they are designed to be.

Clothing must not be tight fitting or otherwise immodest. Carefully monitor low or plunging necklines, low-cut backs, large armholes, etc. Three fingers below the clavicle is a good rule of thumb for the maximum depth of a neckline. Dresses and skirts should not have any slits that extend above the knee.

Patterned or pictured hosiery or leggings that look like pants are not to be worn. If hosiery is not worn, socks must be worn and visible.

Clean, comfortable shoes must be worn. Sandals are permitted if they have a heel strap.

Hair must be clean, feminine, and styled neatly in a natural color.

No large or flashy earrings are permitted.

KINDERGARTEN – SIXTH GRADE GIRLS

Uniforms from Vicki Marsha are required.

Younger elementary girls must wear shorts under their dresses for modesty purposes on the playground.

Elementary girls may only wear “stud” type earrings.

Makeup should not be worn.

SEVENTH – TWELFTH GRADE GIRLS

Uniforms are not required. The clothing worn to school must conform to all of the general dress code and girls’ general dress code guidelines.

Blouses, polo shirts, and knit shirts are permitted. No T-shirts are allowed.

No sundresses or tank tops are permitted.

College names, sport teams, brand names, and NCS related slogans are permitted on the girls’ tops.

Modest make-up that is not distracting or calls excessive attention to the wearer is permitted.

BOYS' DRESS CODE (GENERAL)

Long pants that are not too tight or too baggy must be worn. No jeans or cargo pants are permitted.

Belts must be worn with all pants that have belt loops. Belts should be the correct length, not extending more than a few inches beyond the first belt loop. Polo or button down shirts (long or short sleeve) with a traditional collar must be worn. Shirts should be tucked in and are permitted to have only the top button unbuttoned.

No jewelry except watches or medical tags should be worn.

Hair must be clean, off the ears and collar, and above the eyebrows. No "perms," shaved, dyed, spiked, or extreme haircuts are allowed. Sideburns are to be no longer than the middle of the ear.

Young men should be clean-shaven at all times.

Clean, comfortable, shoes must be worn with socks. Sandals are not permitted.

KINDERGARTEN – SIXTH GRADE BOYS

Uniforms from Vicki Marsha are required.

SEVENTH – TWELFTH GRADE BOYS

Uniforms are not required. The clothing worn to school must conform to all of the general dress code and boys' general dress code guidelines.

College names, sport teams, brand names, and NCS related slogans are permitted on the boys' shirts.
