

ENROLLMENT PROCESS

A parent interview form must be completed, followed by an interview with the principal. At least one parent and the prospective student(s) must attend the interview. Students must bring the following to the interview: first through ninth grades – last report card; tenth through twelfth grades – high school transcript; seventh through twelfth grades – letters of recommendation and student essay. Following the interview, with provisional acceptance given, a completed application form and registration fees must be given to the school office before final acceptance can be granted. New students may need to be tested at a fee of \$30.00.

REGISTRATION

A \$500.00 registration fee is required for each student (K5 – 12th grade) who enrolls. Registration fees once paid are non-refundable and non-transferable. Kindergarten students must provide a birth certificate and immunization record. First grade students must have a physical examination by a medical doctor.

EXTENDED DAYCARE

Your child may be on campus from 7:50 A.M. to 3:15 P.M. (K5 - 6th) or from 7:50 A.M. to 3:45 P.M. (7th - 12th) without any additional charge. An elementary student with a Jr. or Sr. High school sibling may remain on campus until 3:45 P.M. Extended daycare is available from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. Students on campus outside of the extended daycare times will be charged a rate of \$1.00 per minute.

HALF-DAY KINDERGARTEN

The half-day five-year-old kindergarten program begins at 8:00 A.M. and ends at 11:30 A.M. Parents may pick up their children between 11:30 A.M. and 12:00 P.M. Students who are on campus after 12:00 P.M. will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per minute. Half-day kindergarten students will not be eating lunch at school. On the rare occasion that a half-day kindergarten student must stay for the afternoon session until 3:00 P.M., notify the school office by 11:00 A.M. A \$30.00 fee will be billed to your account.

TUITION

Tuition is an annual fee paid in full by August 1st or made in ten equal monthly payments, August 1st through May 1st. Monthly payments are due the 1st of each month and are late after the 5th. A \$20.00 late fee will be charged if tuition payments are made after the 5th of the month. Tuition payments can be made using the following methods: automatic transfer (preferred method) from a checking, savings, or credit card account, or by paying in the school office using cash, check, or credit card. Forms are available in the school office to establish the automatic transfer.

OTHER FINANCIAL INFORMATION

If a student enrolls after the August tuition payment is due and before school begins, the August tuition must be paid prior to the student beginning the first day of school. If a student enrolls after school has begun, the annual tuition will be prorated based on the number of school days remaining. The monthly payment will be changed accordingly.

Any monies (e.g., tuition, daycare, or late fees) due from the previous school year must be brought current prior to registering for a new school year.

A \$30.00 fee will be assessed for all bounced checks or rejected electronic payments. You will be contacted to bring your account current. If three bounced checks or rejected electronic payments occur in one school year, the balance of your account will be paid on a cash only basis.

Once any school payment (e.g., tuition or daycare) becomes fifteen days late, the student may be automatically dropped from enrollment and may not be allowed to attend class or obtain class work. Parents will be notified concerning their unpaid bill and will be given an opportunity to make the necessary payment before the child is dropped from enrollment.

Daycare changes must be made by the 15th of the month and will go into affect on the first day of the following month. Two daycare changes per account free of charge will be allowed for the school year. Subsequent changes will cost \$20.00.

Discounts on tuition for multiple students in the same immediate family are given. Contact the school office for the tuition rates.

Terminated accounts created by withdrawing a student are pro-rated to the day to insure that charges are made only for services rendered.

Drop-in daycare rates for those families who need occasional daycare are \$5.00 for morning daycare and \$12.00 for evening daycare.

Each graduating senior must pay a \$50.00 senior graduation fee by the first Friday in May.
